# The Path to SUCCESS is ALWAYS UNDER CONSTRUCTION





# **AGC Legislative News**

2016 Election: AGC/ **CONPAC** Worked to **Shape Election Results** 

The 2016 election in South Dakota is in the books and AGC participated in shaping the outcome in a big way.



# **Constitutional Amendments and Initiated** Measures

There were ten Constritutional Amendments and Initated Measures on the ballot this year, and AGC participated in three of them. Constitutional Amendment R, which will allow the South Dakota Legislature




to establish a governance system for the technical institutes, was approved by voters. AGC was involved in passage of R, as technical institutes provide the basis of our valuable work force. AGC opposed Initiated Measure 22, which calls for publicly funded political campaigns and puts restrictions on contributions that PACS can give to candidates. IM 22 passed on election night. AGC and other groups are analyzing the impact of IM 22, and assessing any options to alleviate its impact legislatively. Initiated Measure 23 was a threat to South Dakota's right-to-work laws and asked that employees pay union dues even if they are not union members. IM 23 was put on our ballot by out of state untions. AGC took the lead in defeating this measure, which was trounced 79.6% to 20.3%, sending a message to unions that South Dakota likes their right-to-work status just fine.

AGC also selected legislative candidates to receive campaign contributions through the Contractors

Political Action Committee, or CONPAC.

CONPAC is one of South Dakota's more active, and effective, political action committees. In 2016, CONPAC worked to shape the makeup of the South Dakota



business-friendly legislative candidates. CONPAC also provided funding for Constitutional Amendment R and Initiated Measure 23, ensuring passage of R and defeat of IM 23.

And CONPAC is already gearing up for the 2018 election cycle, which will feature a gubernatorial race in addition to constitutional officers, all legislative seats and whatever ballot measure may arise. Plans are underway for fundraising efforts and a CONPAC membership drive. When you contribute to CONPAC, you are a member and take part in contribution decisions and delivery of campaign contributions to candidates. Make plans now to join for the next election cycle. You can join at the AGC convention in January or email info@sdagc.org for membership information.

### **AGC Members are Informed Voters!**

When AGC members prepare to vote, they look for the best information available. And they certainly received the inside scoop on the 2016 constitutional amendments and ballot



measures. AGC invited South Dakota's Attorney General Marty Jackley to provide insight on the amendments and measures. It is one of Attorney General Jackley's responsibilities to write the official ballot explanations for these amendments and measures, so AGC members got the best information available on their impact to the construction industry.

AGC thanks Attorney General Jackley for his insight and time, and also thanks all the members who attended this ballot measure briefing.

AGC also shared an analysis of Constitutional Amendment S, Initiated Measure 22 and Initiated Measure 23 with members. This piece allowed AGC members to be the best informed



voters on these issues, and encouraged members to get out and vote on Election Day. Many members shared this piece with their employees at safety meetings, via in-house newsletters and email. Thanks to all of our members for sharing ballot measure information.

# **Blowing the Whistle**

The Occupational Health and Safety Administration ("OSHA") is charged with ensuring employee safety by prohibiting unsafe work practices. The regulations applicable to the construction industry are extensive. In order to ensure that its


primary mission of protecting workers is not thwarted by employers, OSHA has authority to protect workers from retaliation under twenty-two federal laws that have come to be known as the whistle-blower protection statutes. With so many regulations, it should come as no surprise that whistle-blower complaints to OSHA are on the rise. Statistics released by OSHA show a steady increase in whistle-blower complaints from 2005 to 2015.

Retaliation can take many forms. It is essentially any adverse action that affects an employee who has engaged in protected activity. What constitutes protected activity is also extremely broad. Making a complaint to OSHA constitutes protected activity. Commencing an OSHA proceeding also constitutes protected activity. Testifying or preparing to testify in an OSHA proceeding is protected. Knowing the difference between action taken in retaliation and otherwise legitimate conduct by the employer can be difficult. This is particularly true when an employee is refusing to work due to allegedly unsafe conditions.

There is no express or implied right to walk off the job "because of potential unsafe conditions at the work-place." Ordinarily an employer may discipline employees "for refusing to perform normal job activities because of alleged safety or health hazards." On the other hand, an employee may not be disciplined for not performing tasks that may cause serious injury or death and if the employee has no reasonable alternative. The conditions must be such that a "reasonable person" would conclude there is a real danger and there is insufficient time to eliminate the danger through statutory enforcement channels. In addition, in such circumstances, the employee, where possible, must also have sought from his employer, and been unable to obtain, a correction of the dangerous condition.

All employers (and particularly construction industry employers) should become familiar with the applicable OSHA regulations. When safety issues do arise, serious consideration should be given to the issue, regardless of the source, and without retribution. Responding to a whistle-blower complaint to OSHA is far more burdensome and potentially expensive than correcting the safety issue in the first instance. Upon receipt of notification of a whistle-blower complaint by OSHA employers should seriously consider hiring the assistance of competent advisors to prepare a response.



Not only were they at all of the Construction Awareness Day's they have been being used by AGC members, middle schools and most recently at a career fair at Central High School. At this





# **Fall Safety Summit Sees Record Attendance!**

The AGC Fall Safety Summit experienced 35 attendees

for day one and was held October 20th and 21st in Sioux Falls. Thursday was highlighted by Sheila Stanley, Area Director, OSHA Sioux Falls Area Office. She passed along some interesting statistics to those in attendance.



Attendees learned that the Sioux Falls Area Office has been very busy with a limited staff so far. As of October 20, 2016, the Sioux Falls Area Office has conducted 97 inspections, with some assistance from Montana and North Dakota. Prior to that, the Bismarck Area Office in North Dakota jurisdiction included South Dakota. The Construction sector accounted for 49 of these inspections, 26 in the manufacturing sector and 22 all other sectors. The Sioux Falls Area office has handled 112 complaints, 27 of which resulted in on-



site inspections. Sioux
Falls OSHA office has
handled 6 fatalities under
it's jurisdiction in the past
year. Causes of these
fatalities were attributed
to fall, electrocution,
explosion, fire, equipment

operations, and forklift. The Sioux Falls office has also conducted inspections on 8 employer reported injuries. The Sioux Falls Area Office is in the process of opening their permanent office which will be located at 4404 South Technology Drive in Sioux Falls.

# **MSHA Issues Blocking Against Motion Alert**

Since September 16, 2015, the mining community has suffered three serious accidents involving mining equipment and machinery that have resulted in fatalities. Because of this, MSHA has issued a Safety Alert. Included in the alert are best practices to follow to prevent accidents, including conducting a Risk Assessment to evaluate pivot points and ask, "What can happen?" # OSHA delays enforcement of anti-retaliation provisions of injury and illness tracking rule until December 1.

OSHA has agreed to further delay enforcement of the anti-retaliation provisions in its injury and illness tracking rule until Dec. 1, 2016. The U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas requested the delay to allow additional time to consider a motion challenging the new provisions.

The anti-retaliation provisions were originally scheduled to begin Aug. 10, 2016, but were previously delayed until Nov. 10 to allow time for outreach to the regulated community. Under the rule, employers are required to inform workers of their right to report work-related injuries and illnesses without fear of retaliation; implement procedures for reporting injuries and illnesses that are reasonable and do not deter workers from reporting; and incorporate the existing statutory prohibition on retaliating against workers for reporting injuries and illnesses.

Motorists are reminded that snowplows travel at 25-30 mph or less when plowing or placing deicing chemicals. Drivers need to stay alert for the slow moving snowplows and stay a safe distance behind the plow. When conditions allow, snowplows will pull over periodically to let traffic pass. Please have patience and never pass a plow when visibility is poor. Remember that the snowplow is clearing the roadway in front of you so the best place to be is a safe distance behind it. Crews will update the safetravelusa.com/sd website three times a day: before 7 a.m., between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., and between 4 and 7 p.m. More frequent updates will be made if conditions warrant. Road condition information can also be obtained by calling 511 or you can download the SDDOT511 app from iTunes and Google Play sites.

# 2016 Election Results: AGC PAC Successful in Electing Candidates Friendly to the Construction Industry

In the 2016 House and Senate elections, AGC PAC supported 26 candidates for Senate and 174 candidates for the House of Representatives. Of the 26



(23 Republican | 3 Democrat) Senate candidates, AGC PAC supported, 22 of them won election to the 115th Congress. The four AGC PAC-backed candidates who lost were Mark Kirk (R-III.), Kathy Szeliga (R-Md.), Sen. Joe Heck (R-Nev.) and Sen. Kelly Ayotte (R-N.H.). As of now, the AGC PAC success rating in the Senate is 85 percent. Of the 174 (156 Republican | 18 Democrat) House candidates who received AGC PAC support, 170 of them won election; one race (CA-49) is still outstanding. As of now, the AGC PAC success rating in the House is 98 percent.

# **AGC Analyzes Potential Impact of Trump**

Administration on Labor & Employment, Healthcare, Immigration and Workforce Policy With the election over, AGC has begun looking towards 2017 and the potential impact a new Trump Administration will



have on labor and employment, healthcare, immigration and workforce policy and its effects on the construction industry. # DOL Rule Increases Salary Threshold for Overtime Rule - Effective Dec. 1, 2016

The Department of Labor's final rule increases the overtime coverage by over 100% and will cover over 4 million employees by the end of 2017. The rule increases the salary threshold from \$455 to



\$913 per week for standard salaried employees, and \$100,000 to \$134,004 per year for highly compensated employees. The final rule comes into effect on December 1, 2016. Future automatic updates to these thresholds will occur every three years, beginning on January 1, 2020.

The final rule increases the salary and compensation levels for executive, administrative, and professional workers. Additionally, the final rule amends the salary basis test to allow employers to use nondiscretionary bonuses and incentive payments, such as commissions, to satisfy up to 10 percent of the new standard salary level.

# AGC Efforts Help Move OSHA to Modify Controversial Drug Testing Position

In the wake of an AGC meeting with the head of the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and an AGC-backed letter from dozens of members of Congress, OSHA



recently published new guidance to clarify its injury and illness record keeping and reporting rule. The guidance recalibrates the agency's position relating to post-incident drug testing in the context of employer discouragement of or retaliation for employee injury and illness reporting. Generally speaking, the new guidance is more likely than the agency's previous position to not overly restrict many construction companies' existing policies regarding employee postincident drug testing. However, the agency notes that drug testing employees whose injury could not possibly have arisen from any particular incident, like muscular skeletal disorders (e.g., tendonitis), would likely violate the rule. Additionally, the agency further clarifies that OSHA will not issue citations under the rule for postincident drug testing conducted in accordance with state workers' compensation laws—whether drug testing under the law is mandatory or voluntary.

# House Passes Career and Technical Education Bill, AGC Calls on Senate to Act

The U.S. House of Representatives passed the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act recently by an overwhelming vote of 405-5. The near unanimous vote shows the broad support for the bill, which reforms and



reinvigorates the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act (Perkins) to meet the current workforce needs through better program alignment, better reporting, increased work-based learning, promoting industry-recognized credentials and increased federal investment. The bill generally addresses AGC recommendations and AGC is calling on the U.S. Senate to swiftly consider the bill.

The Perkins bill authorizes funding for career and technical education programs, providing more than \$1 billion annually to high schools and postsecondary vocational training programs. The bill was last authorized over a decade ago, and it no longer addresses the skills gap in today's workforce. The legislation gives greater flexibility to states on how they spend their allotments, improves performance metrics and aligns the programs with other education and workforce training legislation: the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). Similar to other education and workforce training programs, the success of the program rests on how it is ultimately implemented and how well employers collaborate and engage with educators in their local and state communities.

# Successful Highway & Transportation Construction Conference Addresses Cutting Edge Issues

AGC's 2016 Highway and Transportation Construction Conference addressed many of the cutting edge issues facing the industry in the short and long term from funding to new technologies. Happening just days before the 2016 National elections there was much discussion about the impact of the elections on the transportation infrastructure market and specifically funding. Former Transportation Secretary Mary Peters recalled how important it is for the next Transportation Secretary to make the case early within the new Administration for transportation investment to ensure it is an Administration priority. Past AGC President Doug Pruitt discussed the book he has written on the steps necessary to save Sundt Construction Company from bankruptcy when he became CEO. There were

lessons to be learned for all the contractors present. A speaker discussed the impact of autonomous cars on transportation infrastructure pointing out that widespread use may reduce the need for highway expansions thus impacting the future construction market.

### **Building a Better Congress**

AGC PAC is the nonpartisan political action committee (PAC) sponsored by AGC of America. It is registered with the U.S. Federal Election Commission (FEC) and allows eligible employees of AGC member companies to pool personal,
