

The South Dakota Transportation Hall of Honor dates back to 1972 and now includes 86 inductees. Congratulations to both Clyde & Mark!!








AGC/SDDOT Transportation Summit Details!

2018 Legislative Session Around the Corner

The run up to the 93rd South Dakota Legislative Session begins in earnest with the Governor's Budget Address on



Tuesday, December 5. As usual, AGC will be there to see how the state's budget proposal will shape up. Session officially begins on Tuesday, January 9 at noon with Governor Daugaard's final State of the State address. AGC will again have a full-time presence at the Capitol to represent the construction industry.

As people begin to think about session, draft bills and ideas about bills are beginning to circulate among stakeholders. As early as mid-December, AGC's Government Affairs Committee may meet to discuss bills of interest to the construction industry. Some of the topics that are being floated include TIFs, fees for construction storm water runoff permits, bills from the Initiative and Referendum and Government Accountability Task Forces, eliminating the tort of bad faith from workers' compensation insurance and a proposal to remove three-axle trucks from motor carrier annual inspection exemptions.

When there is a bill of interest to the construction industry, the Government Affairs Committee receives an analysis of the bill, a link so they can read the bill, and have an opportunity to ask questions and provide input on what stance AGC will adopt for the bill. Also, every Tuesday during session, the Government Affairs Committee meets via telephone to discuss legislative action. Thanks in advance for your participation in the legislative process; the more contractor involvement we have, the better the resulting legislative outcome.

And finally, please make plans to attend the AGC Day at the Legislature and the AGC Annual Legislative Dinner on January 30, 2018. Last year, contractors spent time in legislative committees, talked to



their legislators on the House and Senate floor, and met with different government agencies during the afternoon. The Legislative Dinner is a popular event with legislators, so we hope you can join us and have dinner with your legislator.

DENR Proposed Storm Water Permits Webinar



AGC Legal Minute

DBE GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE) is administered through the United States Department of Transportation (US DOT). At least three major operations are included in the DBE program, and they are the

Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Transit Administration.

According to the US DOT website, the purpose of the program is to ensure non-discrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts, to remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT-assisted contracts, and to assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside of the DBE program.



Bidders for these federally assisted projects are required to either meet the DBE contract goal or demonstrate "good faith efforts to meet the goal." 49 CFR § 26.53. If the bidder does not meet the DBE goal, then it must adequately document those good faith efforts. But what are good faith efforts?

The federal regulations provide guidance in a document entitled "Guidance Concerning Good Faith Efforts." Appendix A to Part 26 (the "Guide"). Bidders are encouraged to read the whole Guide, which can be found on the internet on any number of websites. It is a relatively short document and it contains a lot of good information.

In general, the Guide indicates that bidders are required to work diligently to meet the DBE goal for the project. Bidders are required to show that they took all "necessary and reasonable steps" to achieve

the DBE goal. The bidder's efforts should demonstrate that they are "actively and aggressively" trying to meet the DBE contract goal. This means more than going through the motions. Bidders must reach out to DBEs well ahead of any required bid deadline. Mailing out solicitations, without more, is not enough. Bidders should determine with certainty if the DBEs are interested by taking appropriate steps to follow up on initial solicitations.

The Guide indicates good faith efforts may include:

- Selecting portions of the work to be performed by DBEs even though the prime contractor might otherwise prefer to perform these work items with its own forces.
- Using a DBE over a less expensive subcontractor that is not a DBE, especially if the quotes are close.
- Breaking out contract work items into smaller units and more economically feasible units.
- Establishing flexible time frames for performance and delivery schedules.

If the DBE goal is not met by the apparent low bidder, but other bidders met the DBE goal, it raises serious questions about the effort of the bidder that did not. This can lead to a bid protest. If a bid protest ensues, the apparent low bidder's bid will be scrutinized, pursuant to the requirements of 49 CFR § 26.53 and Appendix A to Part 26.

There are many legal decisions upholding the authority of federally assisted agencies to throw out bids that do not sufficiently demonstrate good faith efforts. Frequently, courts



and agencies cite as evidence a bidder's failure to provide all of the required documentation concerning its efforts, failure to follow upon on initial solicitations, failure to break out work into smaller units, and the fact that other bidders met the goal. To avoid bid protests and possible bid rejection, bidders should start early to obtain maximum participation. Ob-


tain DBE participant lists from the relevant agencies. Solicitations should be made early and often. DBEs need to be given clear instructions about how and when to participate. A firm deadline needs to be communicated. Bidders should make certain that DBEs are not interested in bid-



ding well ahead of that deadline. Offering assistance to DBEs to put their quotes together can be helpful. It is up to the bidder to document these efforts.

If a bidder does not meet the goal, then the documents demonstrating good faith efforts will be critically examined. It may be necessary to explain why certain DBE quotes were not used if another subcontractor is to be used or if the work is to be self-performed. When it comes to meeting the DBE good faith requirements, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. This requires prior preparation, planning, and follow through.


WFD Steering Committee Needs More Members

Full OSHA Enforcement of the Silica in Construction Standard Begins

On October 23, 2017, the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) began full enforcement of



its respirable crystalline silica standard for construction. If your construction company operates under OSHA state-plans in one of 26 states or two territories, it is important that you check to see if your OSHA state-plan agency is following the federal OSHA's lead with this enforcement policy. Although AGC remains engaged in litigation against the rule in federal court, a final decision is not expected until 2018, at the earliest. As such, AGC continues to engage the Trump administration.

In the meantime, AGC recognizes that construction companies must abide by the silica regulation, because it is the law. That is why we developed the "Respirable Crystalline Silica in Construction" webpage with a host of resources—sample forms, webinars, flowcharts, FAQs, and more—to help AGC members understand their compliance responsibilities. House GOP Unveils Tax Reform Bill

In early November, House Republican leaders unveiled their long-awaited tax reform bill, a broad rewrite of the tax code built around lowered individual and business tax rates, as well as an expanded



tax base. Republicans have made clear their intent to pass and sign the bill into law before year's end, noting that the 429 page bill, H.R. 1, is scheduled to be taken up for consideration in the House Ways and Means Committee soon. Featuring 120 individual provisions that would add to, augment, or eliminate sections of the current tax code, the Republican tax reform bill—crafted behind closed doors—is already generating intense debate among business leaders. Steve Sandherr, CEO of AGC of America, has already weighed in on the unfolding debate, noting that AGC "will work to ensure that pass-through businesses, including the majority of construction firms, also benefit from tax reform." AGC looks forward to providing its members with greater, construction-specific analysis in the coming weeks.

AGC Attends Meeting with President Trump on Tax Reform

AGC of America's CEO Stephen Sandherr attended a meeting at the White House in early November with President Trump and other high-ranking officials to discuss tax



reform. AGC continues to advocate for the priorities of the construction industry, such as lowering tax rates for both corporations and pass-through businesses, simplifying tax preparation, and promoting infrastructure investment. AGC will evaluate any future proposal introduced to see if it reflects the association's priorities.

Government Funded Through December, Congress Works on FY18 Funding

Congress recently averted a fiscal showdown at the end of the month by passing a short-term bill through Dec. 8 that funded programs at FY 2017 levels, included a down payment on disaster



relief and raised the debt ceiling. Congress must still work to pass legislation that funds the government for the remainder of the 2018 fiscal year. The House completed action on the remaining 8 of 12 annual appropriations bills in an omnibus bill, the other four having been passed previously. This is the first time in more than a decade that the House has passed all 12 bills before the end of a current fiscal year. The Senate has not passed any of the necessary bills. Included in the House omnibus bill is funding for DOT programs, with full-funding for highway and transit programs at FAST Act levels. The bill eliminates TIGER grant program funding (\$500 million in FY 17) cuts transit capital grants by \$650 million and maintains Airport Improvement Program grants at \$3.35 billion. Action now moves to the Senate where the appropriations committee reported out its version of the transportation funding bill. Differences in the Senate bill includes \$550 million in funding for the TIGER grant program and a \$4 increase in the Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) ticket tax dedicated for airport infrastructure.

Trump Releases Immigration Reform Principles, AGC Concerned Changes Conflict with Industries Priorities

President Trump recently issued his priorities for

immigration reform.
The crux of his 70-point policy will be used as bargaining chips for Trump's support for continuing the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program.



The other priorities were grouped by increased border security – including building a southern border wall – increased interior enforcement – including mandatory e-verify – and a merit-based legal immigration system that prioritizes skill-based immigration.

The President's agenda contrasts with many of AGC's immigration priorities and lacks Congressional support, making it unlikely to advance as a whole. However, the debate could jumpstart Congressional action. AGC will use the opportunity to push for reforming the broken immigration system by restructuring the visa system, improving border security and addressing the undocumented workers already in the U.S.

House T&I Subcommittee Leaders Ask for HTF Fix in Tax Reform

House Highway and Transit Subcommittee Chairman Sam Graves (R-MO) and ranking member Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-D.C.) sent a letter recently to top House tax writers asking that they "give serious consideration to addressing" the Highway Trust Fund's solvency as they craft tax legislation. The correspondence was sent in response to release of an outline of the proposed tax reform legislation which did not address infrastructure. The letter pointed out that, "Earlier this year, over 250 members of the House of Representatives, a majority of both parties, signed a letter asking the House Ways and Means Committee to include provisions to strengthen the HTF solution as part of tax reform." The letter further points out that, "Any HTF solution should entail a long-term, dedicated, user-based revenue stream that can met the infrastructure investment supported by President Trump and Members of Congress from both parties."

Building a Better Congress

AGC PAC is the nonpartisan political action committee (PAC) sponsored by AGC of America. It is registered with the U.S. Federal Election Commission (FEC) and allows eligible employees of AGC member companies to pool personal, voluntary financial contributions.
